CHARACTERISTICS: Owner centered, highly intelligent, courageous,
obedient, sensitive, faithful, active and alert,
with minimal grooming requirements, usually odorless

SUITABILITY WITH CHILDREN/ANIMALS: Very good with appropriately
behaving children and animals, especially if raised with them

SPECIAL NEEDS: Can be strongly reserved, shy and barky without
intensive socialization during first year and active, involved
owners; not a good "backyard" kept breed; a soft breed that
does not do well with harsh discipline
